

February 6- Construction Contract Drafting Mechanics of P3 Procurement and Contracting

Steven A. Torres is a Partner with Pannone Lopes Devereaux & West LLC and a member of the firm's Municipal Infrastructure Team. He served in the U.S. Air Force from 1987-1990 as a nuclear operations officer. He is admitted to practice law in New York and Massachusetts and is a member of the Massachusetts Bar Association and the New York Bar Association.
